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Guidelines for the Creation of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and Submission of Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) in Accredited Institutions

Introduction

In pursuance of its Action Plan for performance evaluation, assessment and accreditation and quality up-gradation of institutions of higher education, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore proposes that every accredited institution should establish an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as a post-accreditation quality sustenance measure. Since quality enhancement is a continuous process, the IQAC will become a part of the institution's system and work towards realisation of the goals of quality enhancement and sustenance. The prime task of the IQAC is to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic i mprovement in the overall performance of institutions. For this, during the post-accreditation period, it will channelize all efforts and measures of the institution towards promoting its holistic academic excellence.

The guidelines provided in the following pages will guide and facilitate the institution in the creation and operation of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). The work of the IQAC is the first step towards internalization and institutionalization of quality enhancement initiatives. Its success depends upon the sense of belongingness and participation it can inculcate in all the constituents of the institution. It will not be yet another hierarchical structure or a record-keeping exercise in the institution. It will be a facilitative and participative voluntary system/unit/organ of the institution. It has the potential to become a vehicle for ushering in quality enhance ment by working out planned interventionist strategies to remove deficiencies and enhance quality like the ''Quality Grcles' in industries.

Objective The primary aim of IQAC is

- To develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic action to improve the acade mic and administrative performance of the institution.
- To promote measures for institutional functioning towards quality enhancement through internalization of quality culture and institutionalization of best practices.

Strategies

IQAC shall evolve mechanisms and procedures for

- a) Ensuring timely, efficient and progressive performance of academic, administrative and financial tasks;
- b) The relevance and quality of acade mic and research programmes;
- c) Equitable access to and affordability of academic programmes for various sections of society,
- d) Opti mization and integration of modern methods of teaching and learning;
- e) The credibility of evaluation procedures;

- f) Ensuring the adequacy, maintenance and proper allocation of support structure and services;
- g) Sharing of research findings and net working with other institutions in India and abroad.

Functions

Some of the functions expected of the IQAC are:

- a) Development and application of quality bench marks/parameters for various academic and administrative activities of the institution;
- b) Facilitating the creation of a learner-centric environment conducive to quality education and faculty maturation to adopt the required knowledge and technology for participatory teaching and learning process;
- c) Arrangement for feedback response from students, parents and other stakeholders on quality-related institutional processes;
- d) Dissemination of information on various quality parameters of higher education;
- e) Or ganization of inter and intra institutional workshops, seminars on quality related the mes and promotion of quality circles;
- f) Documentation of the various programmes/activities leading to quality improvement;
- g) Acting as a nodal agency of the Institution for coordinating quality-related activities, including adoption and dissemination of best practices;
- h) Development and maintenance of institutional database through MS for the purpose of maintaining/enhancing the institutional quality;
- i) Development of Quality Culture in the institution;
- j) Preparation of the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) as per guidelines and parameters of NAAC, to be submitted to NAAC

Benefits

I QAC will facilitate / contribute

- a) Ensure heightened level of clarity and focus in institutional functioning towards quality enhance ment;
- b) Ensure internalization of the quality culture;
- b) Ensure enhancement and coordination a mong various activities of the institution and institutionalize all good practices;
- c) Provide a sound basis for decision-making to improve institutional functioning,
- d) Act as a dynamic system for quality changes in HEIs;
- e) Build an organised methodology of documentation and internal communication.

Composition of the IQAC

I QAC may be constituted in every institution under the Chair manship of the Head of the institution with heads of important academic and administrative units and a few teachers and a few distinguished educationists and representatives of local management and stakeholders.

The composition of the IQAC may be as follows:

- 1. Chairperson: Head of the Institution
- 2. A few senior administrative officers
- 3. Three to eight teachers
- 4. One member from the Management
- 5. One/t wo no minees from local society, Students and Alumni
- 6. One/t wo no mi nees from Employers /Industrialists/stakeholders
- 7. One of the senior teachers as the coordinator/Director of the IQAC

The composition of the IQAC will depend on the size and complexity of the institution. It helps the institutions in planning and monitoring IQAC also gives stakeholders or beneficiaries a cross-sectional participation in the institution's quality enhancement activities. The guidelines given here are only indicative and will help the institutions for quality sustenance activities.

The membership of such nominated members shall be for a period of two years. The IQAC should meet at least once in every quarter. The quorumfor the meeting shall be two-third of the total number of members. The agenda, minutes and Action Taken Reports are to be documented with official signatures and maintained electronically in a retrievable for mat.

It is necessary for the members of the IQAC to shoulder the responsibilities of generating and promoting a wareness in the institution and to devote time for working out the procedural details. While selecting these members several precautions need to be taken. A few of the mare listed below

- It is advisable to choose persons from various backgrounds who have earned respect for integrity and excellence in their teaching and research Moreover, they should be a ware of the ground realities of the institutional environment. They should be known for their commit ment to improving the quality of teaching and learning.
- It would be appropriate to choose as senior administrators, persons in charge of institutional services such as library, computer center, estate, student welfare, administration, academic tasks, exa mination and planning and development.
- The management representative should be a person who is a ware of the institution's objectives, limitations and strengths and is committed to its improvement. The local society representatives should be of high social standing and should have made significant contributions to society and in particular to education.

The role of coordinator

The role of the coordinator of the I QAC is crucial in ensuring the effective functioning of all the members. The coordinator of the I QAC may be a senior person with expertise in quality aspects. She/he may be a full-time functionary or, to start with, she/he may be a senior academic

/administrator entrusted with the I QAC as an additional responsibility. Secretarial assistance may be facilitated by the administration. It is preferable that the coordinator may have sound knowledge about the computer, its various functions and usage for effective communication.

Operational Features of the IQAC

Quality assurance is a by-product of ongoing efforts to define the objectives of an institution, to have a work planto achieve the mand to specify the checks and balances to evaluate the degree to which each of the tasks is fulfilled Hence devotion and commit ment to improve ment rather than mere institutional control is the basis for devising procedures and instruments for assuring quality. The right balance bet ween the health and growth of an institution needs to be struck. The I QAC has to ensure that what ever is done in the institution for ''education' is done efficiently and effectively with high standards. In order to do this, the I QAC will have to first establish procedures and modalities to collect data and information on various aspects of institutional functioning.

The coordinator of the IQAC and the secretary will have a major role in inplementing these functions. The IQAC may derive major support from the already existing units and mechanis ms that contribute to the functions listed above. The operational features and functions discussed so far are broad-based to facilitate institutions towards acade mic excellence and institutions may adapt the mto their specific needs.

Monitoring Mechanism

The institutions need to submit yearly the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) to NAAC A functional Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and timely submission of Annual Quality Assurance Reports (AQARs) are the Minimum Institutional Requirements (MIR) to volunteer for second, third or subsequent cycle's accreditation During the institutional visit the NAAC peer teams will interact with the IQACs to know the progress, functioning as well quality sustenance initiatives undertaken by the m

The Annual Quality Assurance Reports (AQAR) may be the part of the Annual Report. The AQAR shall be approved by the statutory bodies of the HEIs (such as Syndicate, Governing Council/Board) for the follow up action for necessary quality enhancement measures.

The H gher Education Institutions (HEI) shall submit the AQAR regularly to NAAC The I QACs may create its exclusive window on its institutional website and regularly upload/ report on its activities, as well as for hosting the AQAR

The NAAC Accredited institutions need to submit only the soft copy as word file (.doc/.docx) through e-mail (capuaqar @g mail.com). The file name needs to be submitted with Track I D of the institution and College Name. For example MHCOGN16601-Samudra Arts and Science College, Talia megu-Maharashtra doc or EC_32_A&A_143 dated 3-5-2004-Samudra Arts and Science College, Talia megu-Maharashtra doc. The H gher Education Institutions need not submit the printed hard copy to NAAC. The acknowledge ments would be sent to the institutions through e-mail.

Mandatory Submission of AQAR by IQAC

So far submission of AQARs was not a Mandatory requirement for Institutions applying to NAAC 2^{nd} and subsequent cycles of Assessment and Accreditation (A&A). It has now been decided by the Executive committee of NAAC that regular submission of AQARs should be made mandatory for 2^{nd} and subsequent cycles of accreditation

In view of the decision of **Executive Committee of NAAC** the following will be the pre-requisites for submission of LCI for all H gher Education Institutions (HEIs) opting for 2^{nd} and subsequent cycles of A& A with effect from 16^{th} September 2016:

- → Ha vi ng a functi onal I QAC
- The minutes of I QAC meeting and compliance to the decisions should be uploaded on the institutional website.
- ➡ Mandatory submission of AQARs on a regular basis for institutions undergoing the second and subsequent cycles of Assessment and Accreditation by NAAC
- Upload the AQAR's on institutional website for access to all stakeholders.

The Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) of the IQAC

All NAAC accredited institutions will submit an annual self-reviewed progress report to NAAC, through its I QAC. The report is to detail the tangible results achieved in key areas, specifically identified by the institutional I QAC at the beginning of the academic year. The AQAR will detail the results of the perspective plan worked out by the I QAC (*Note: The AQAR period would be the Academic Year. For example, July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2013*)
